
The race was one of the first major open road races in the country. The winner, Frenchman Louis Wagner, averaged 67.111 mph over 16 laps of the 25.13-mile course.


Our group met June 15 at Habersham Village, heading out on Victory Drive near the site of the race grandstands.

A few details from that first race: According to *The First American Grand Prix: The Savannah Auto Races*, 1908-1911, 250,000 spectators attended.

They included Horace Dodge, Henry Ford and Harvey S. Firestone.





Only nine of the 20 drivers completed the race.

Our small but mighty group finished with coffee at Habersham Village.
