Career: Mark was an Army Aviator, life-support systems officer in charge of aircraft life support systems, and aviation safety officer. He retired from the Army after 27 years, then worked as an Army civilian as the brigade safety officer at Fort Stewart. He was deployed twice to Afghanistan and once to Iraq.

Car: 1967 Austin-Healey 3000. He also has a TR-6. "The first car I had my mom bought for me when I was 16, [and it] was an MGB and I had that car until 1988. Later, I ended up buying an MGB GT and restored it and I had a couple of TR6s and restored them, but I always wanted an Austin-Healey," like his older brother had in 1963.
